Are these matters to be included in a public consultation?</p>	<p>Wayne Tannahill, Assistant Director of Estates and Property, Powys Teaching Health Board The Programme Team have been very much focused on the build process after the initial collaboration activity related to the development of the proposal, submission and approval of the business cases to Welsh Government. The collaboration included a senior Hywel Dda representative, for instance, sitting on the Project Board during this period.</p> <p>We have just entered our 16 week countdown period to project completion and operational go live. This will bring the focus back to the operational need for Readiness for Service and will include an imminent Welsh Government sponsored Gate Review which will consider the organisation’s readiness to make the transition from the specification/solution to implementation and to ‘go live’. Where appropriate it will assess the capabilities of delivery partners and service providers and this will include a review of engagement with neighbouring Health Boards to deliver against business case benefits.</p> <p>Peter Skitt, County Director Ceredigion and Programme Director for the Mid Wales Joint Committee It is up to the Mid Wales Health Boards to ensure engagement on the Bro Ddyfi development happens.
