Key Decisions and Matters Considered by the Sub-Group:**

The Mid Wales Clinical Advisory Group (MWCAG) has met twice during this reporting period – 13th July 2021 and 9th September 2021. Key decisions / matters considered by the group include:

Priority Clinical pathways

MWCAG have agreed that they need to agree some discrete pathways to work together on and noted there are some Value Based Healthcare pathways which could be used. They have also discussed the recovery of services with the potential for sharing of resources to support recovery and also rapid diagnostic centres and how these could be developed within Powys. The group has had initial discussions on agreeing its top two to three clinical pathways with a final discussion and agreement planned for its next meeting in November 2021. Those suggested areas include:

- Urology
- Ophthalmology
- Neurology / Neurology specialities
- Dermatology
- Frailty
- Vascular including Endocrinology and Diabetes
- Elective care
- Rapid Diagnostic Centres
- Prehabilitation
- Respiratory
- Mental Health
- Social Care

Clinical Networks

The programme of Clinical Network events has provided clarity over what clinicians want for Mid Wales and what they want to take forward. There was now a need to ensure this was made to work from a commissioning and delivery perspective. The next level was to interpret the clinical discussions with the involvement of commissioners in order to ensure this was well governed from a contracting point of view.

Upper GI Cancer pathway

The group noted that the MWJC Programme Director was meeting with the three Health Board Medical Directors on 27th September 2021 to discuss the possible future approach and appetite for the Mid Wales Upper GI Pathway. An update on the outcome of these discussions and the work undertaken to date will be provided to the next meeting of MWCAG for agreement of its recommendation on whether any further work will be undertaken on changing the current Upper GI Pathway for Mid Wales.

North Powys Wellbeing Programme

Updates on the progress of the North Powys Wellbeing Programme is a standing agenda item for MWCAG. Work is in progress on the development of the SOP and an update on the phasing and engagement plan will be provided to the next MWCAG meeting.

Primary and Community Care workforce

Following discussions by and the agreement of MWCAG, a joint cluster meeting has been arranged for 22nd November 2021 in order to start discussions within primary care on GP portfolio and rotation opportunities. Those invited to attend the session include Cluster Leads and Locality/Cluster Managers for South Gwynedd, North Ceredigion and North Powys and members of the MWJC team who will facilitate the session.

Bronglais General Hospital Strategy: Delivering Excellent Rural Acute Care – Implementation

The group received a presentation on the implementation plan for the clinical strategy for Bronglais General Hospital which was a three year objective for HDdUHB. The 3 year implementation plan is focused around the following areas:

- Schedule Care Services
- Therapy Services
- Laboratory Services
- Optimising the use of the Bronglais Estate
- Paediatric Services pathway
- Radiology Services
- Acute Frailty team establishment.
- Same Day Emergency Care including the development of key pathways in general surgery, respiratory, cardiology.
- Developing a Digital Strategy for Bronglais for digital opportunities and solutions.

The Covid-19 pandemic has delayed its delivery, however, progress towards delivery of the strategy had been made in many areas, in particular:

- Progress on its aim of having no single-handed specialties.
- Re-instatement of Colorectal Surgery.
- Cardiology services through the development of the CT Angio and Pacing Service.
- Partnership with Aberystwyth University including an integrated School of Nursing in

Aberystwyth which was due to take its first intake in September 2022.

- Ceredigion, including Bronglais, has been chosen to be the Health Board's pilot county for enhanced technology.
